About This Report

This report describes crime incidents in the ABSPY intervention area over the Spring months of March, April, and May 2022. It is divided into 6 sections: one for each hot spot (Rose Street, Rainier & Henderson, Light Rail, Lake Washington, Our Safe Way) and a summary of all hot spots for the quarter. Each section contains the following data:

1. Number of police incidents in Spring 2022 compared to the eight previous Springs, 2011-2021 (by age group and broad category: person, property, society, or other)
2. Number of selected offenses in Spring 2022 compared to the eight previous Springs, 2011-2021 (by age group and offenses of interest at the hot spot: aggravated and simple assault, robbery, theft, and disturbance and dispute)

Definitions

The definitions of “offenses” and “incidents” have changed from previous reports due to the Seattle Police Department changing their data collection format to reflect NIBRS. The numbers in this report should not be compared to past reports.

- **Offenses:** Offenses are events that have criminal activity involved. Every offense involved in a single crime activity is reported in the data as a single, distinct crime. There may also be incidents involved within offenses; these are non-crime police activities that took place within the event. We prioritize violent offenses in this analysis. See the example below for information about how this affects the numbers.
 - **Incident/Offense Example:** A report will contain all of the offenses or incidents that occurred during a single event. For example, during a traffic stop a driver is arrested for DUI and the police impound their vehicle. The DUI is classified as the **offense** because this is the crime that took place during this event. The vehicle impound is classified as an **incident** because this is a police action that took place during the same event, but it is not a crime event.
- **Person Offenses:** Crimes involving a person as a victim, e.g. assault, aggravated assault.
- **Property Offenses:** Crimes involving loss of or damage to someone’s property, e.g. robbery, theft, burglary, property damage, arson.
- **Society Offenses:** Crimes that affect public order and quality of life, e.g. disturbances, liquor violations, drugs, threatening behavior, weapons, prostitution.
- **Other Offenses:** Crimes that do not fit into person, property, or disorder categories, such as fraud and trespassing.
- **Youths:** Individuals 25 years old or younger.
- **Adults:** Individuals 26 years old or older.

Caveats

1. Seattle Police Department uses NIBRS data formatting to count and prioritize offenses, with NIBRS grouping categories “Group A” and “Group B” separating the more serious crimes from the less serious crimes respectively.
2. Crime trends can change rapidly from month to month, especially in small areas.
3. Seattle Police Department recently switched to the NIBRS reporting system and is still in the process of compiling their new database. The new data categorize some offenses differently and as such, numbers are subject to change and should not be compared to previous reports.

Major Trends

1. Person offenses have decreased for youths and adults since last Spring.
2. Property offenses have increased for youths, but decreased for adults, since last Spring.

Hot Spot Specific Trends

Rose Street

1. Person and property crimes have decreased for youths since last Spring.
2. Person crimes have increased for adults since last Spring.

Rainier and Henderson

1. Property offenses have increased for youths since last Spring.
2. Person offenses increased, but property offenses decreased for adults since last Spring.

Light Rail

1. Property offenses have decreased for adults since last Spring.
2. The frequency of all other crimes are the same as last Spring for adults and youths.

Lake Washington

1. Person and property offenses decreased for youths and adults since last Spring.
2. Aggravated assault decreased for adults since last Spring.

Our Safe Way

1. Property and society offenses increased for adults since last Spring.
2. Person and property offenses decreased for adults since last Spring.

- Adults: There were 869 offenses for adults in all hotspots in March, April, and May 2011-2022.

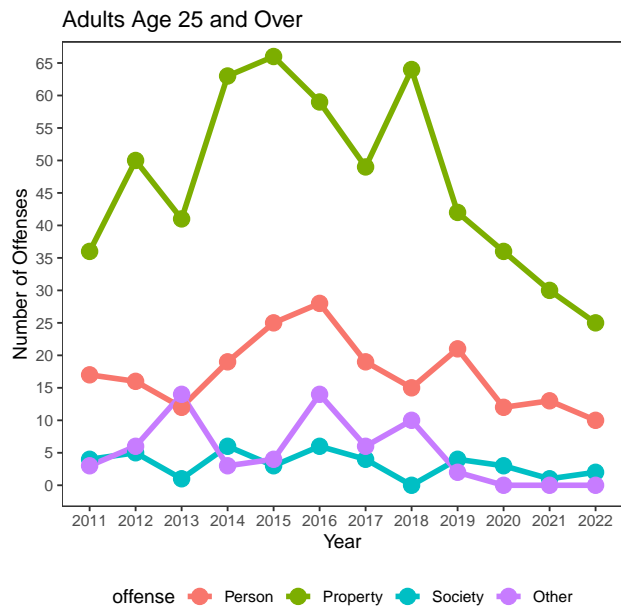
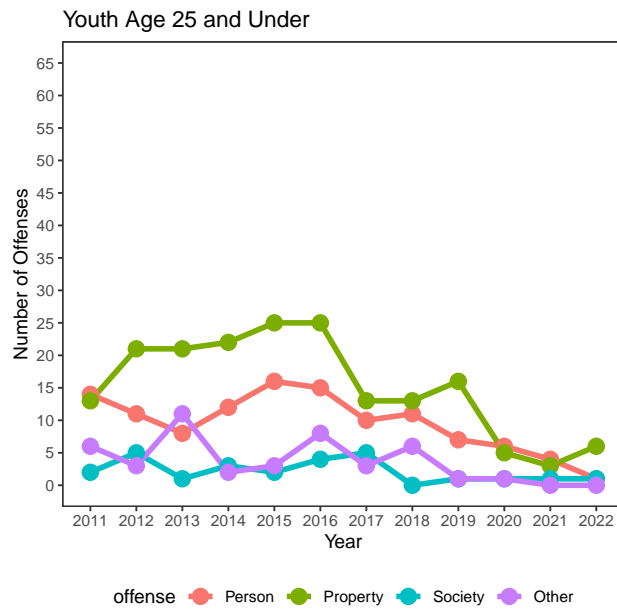

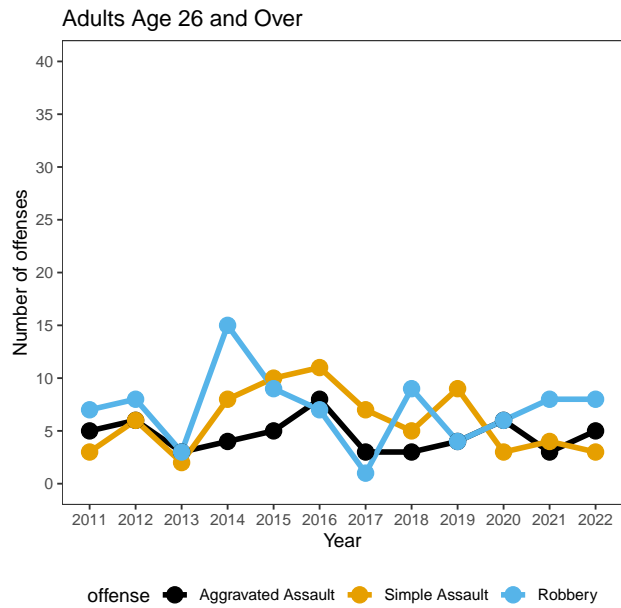

- Adults: There were 117 offenses for adults in the Rose Street location in March, April, and May 2011-2022.

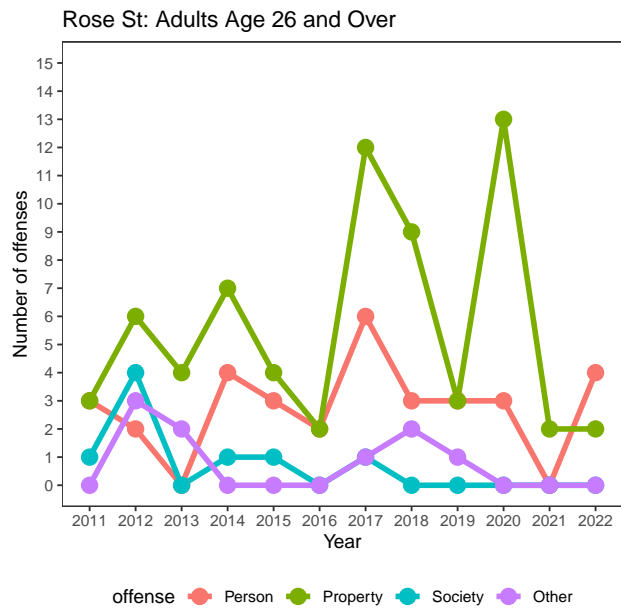
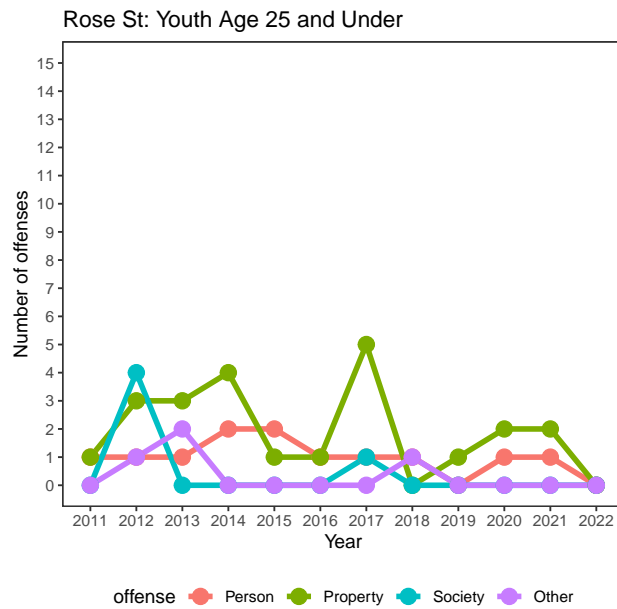

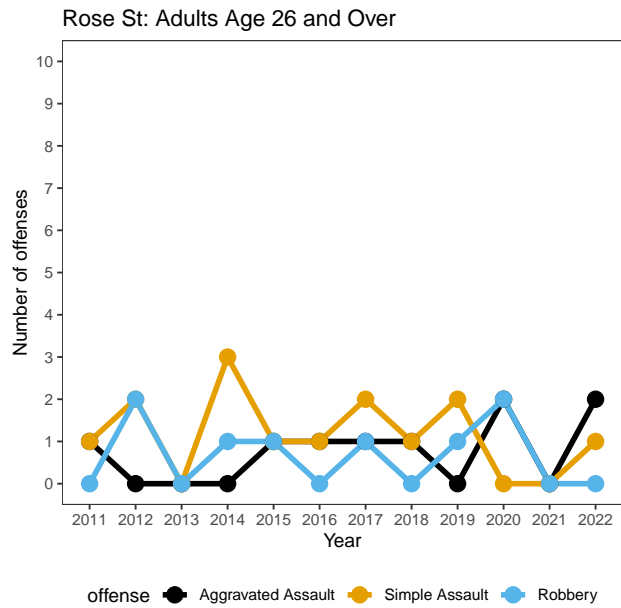

- Adults: There were 278 offenses for adults in the Rainier and Henderson location in March, April, and May 2011-2022.

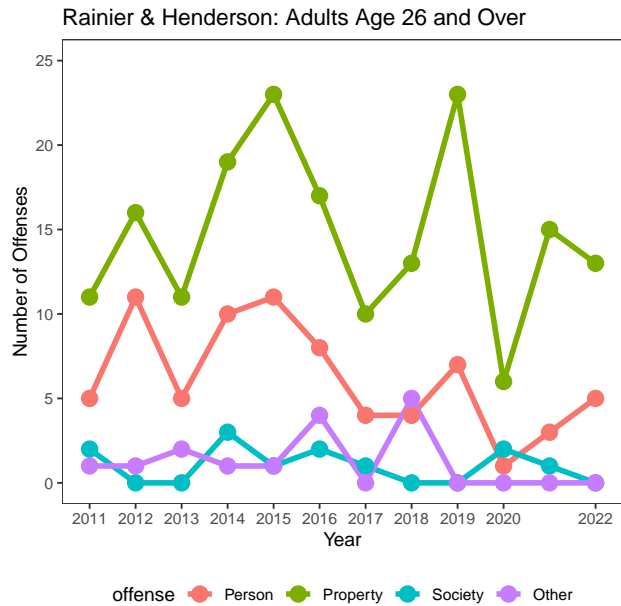
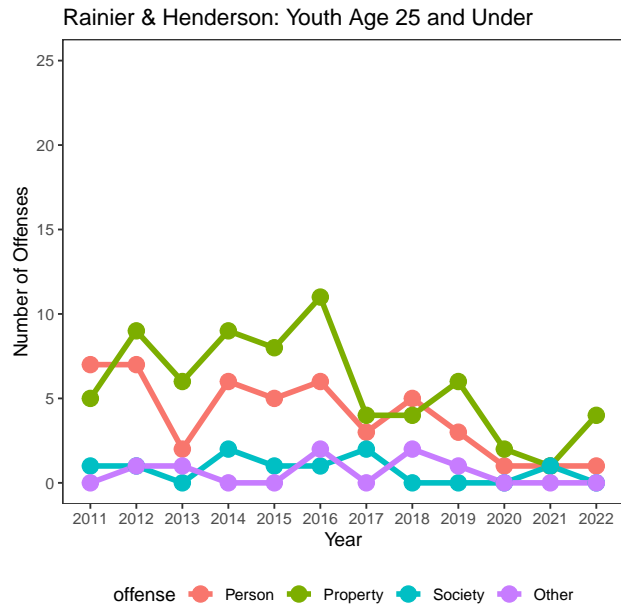

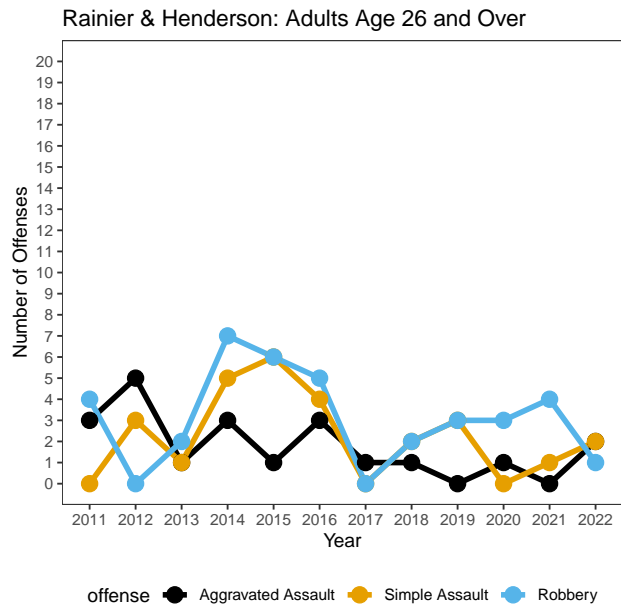

- Adults: There were 30 offenses for adults in the Light Rail location in March, April, and May 2011-2022.

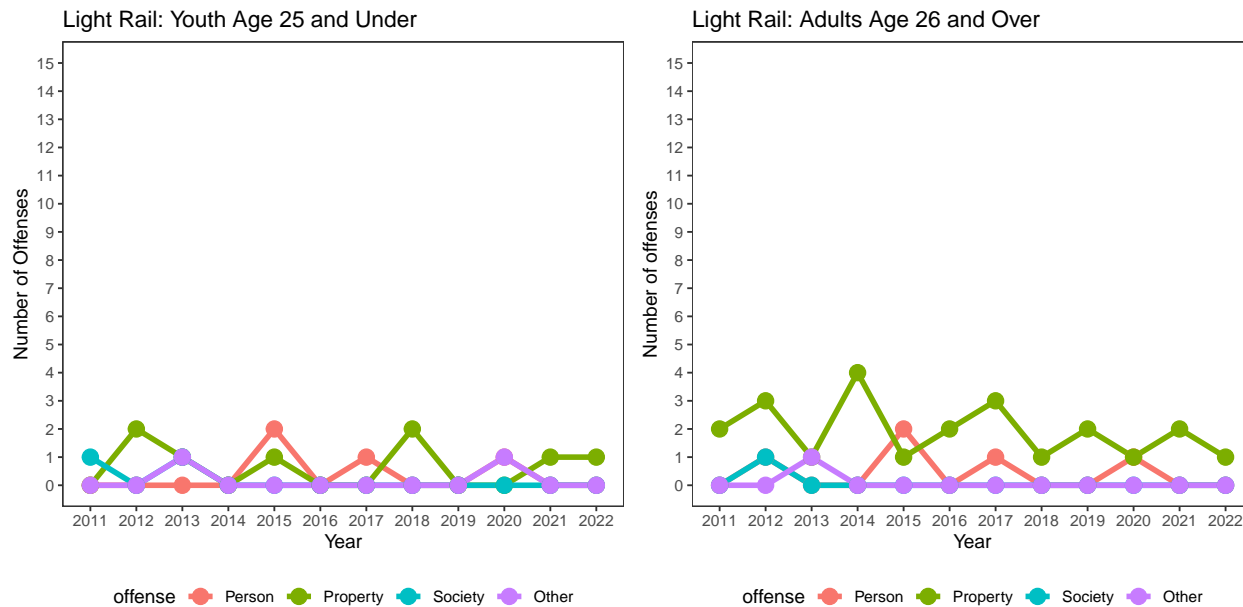

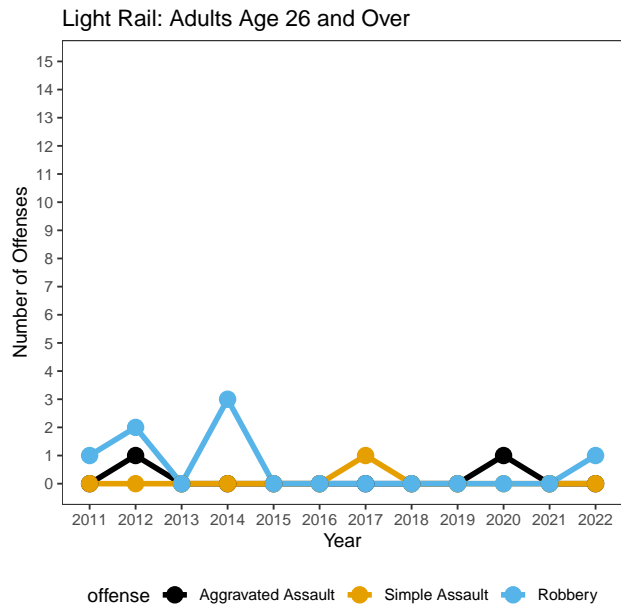
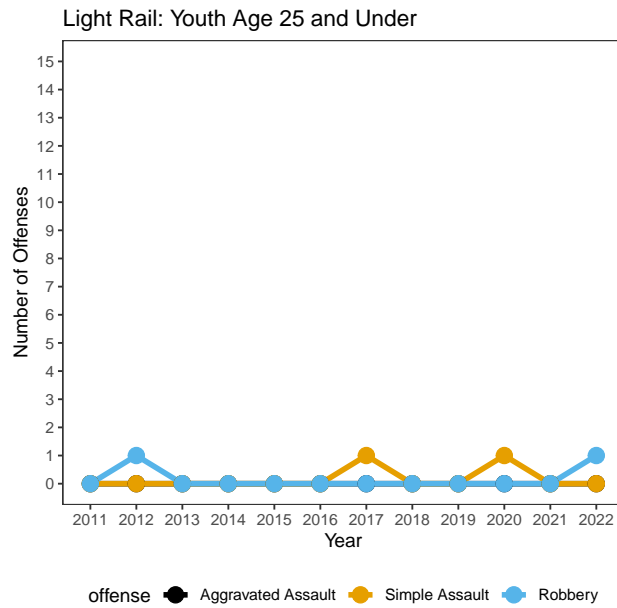

- Adults: There were 173 offenses for adults in the Lake Washington location in March, April, and May 2011-2022.

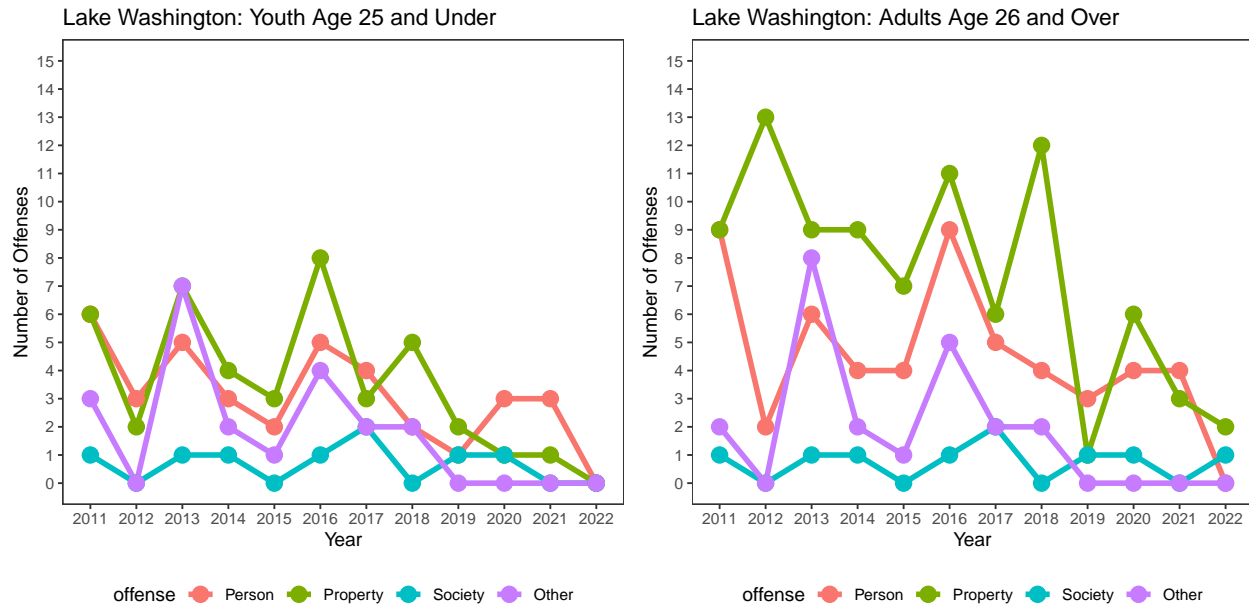

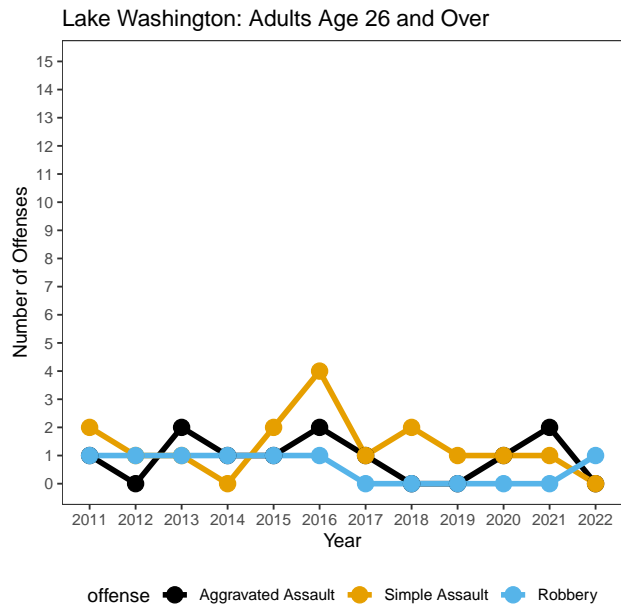
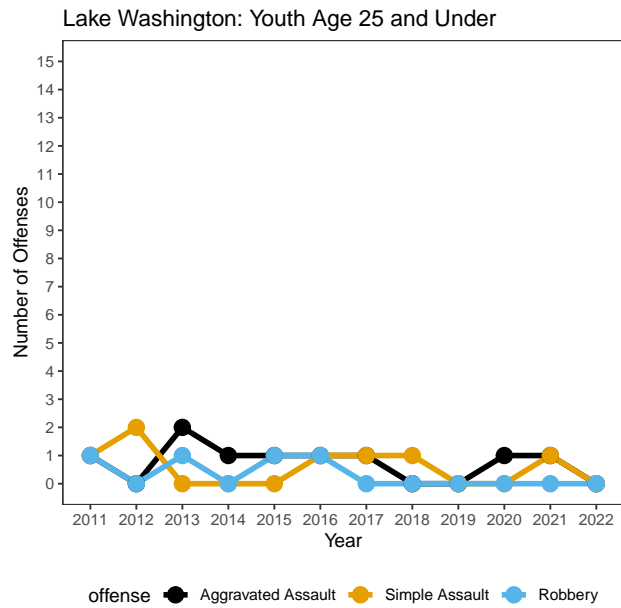

- Adults: There were 271 offenses for adults in the Safe Way location in March, April, and May 2011-2022.

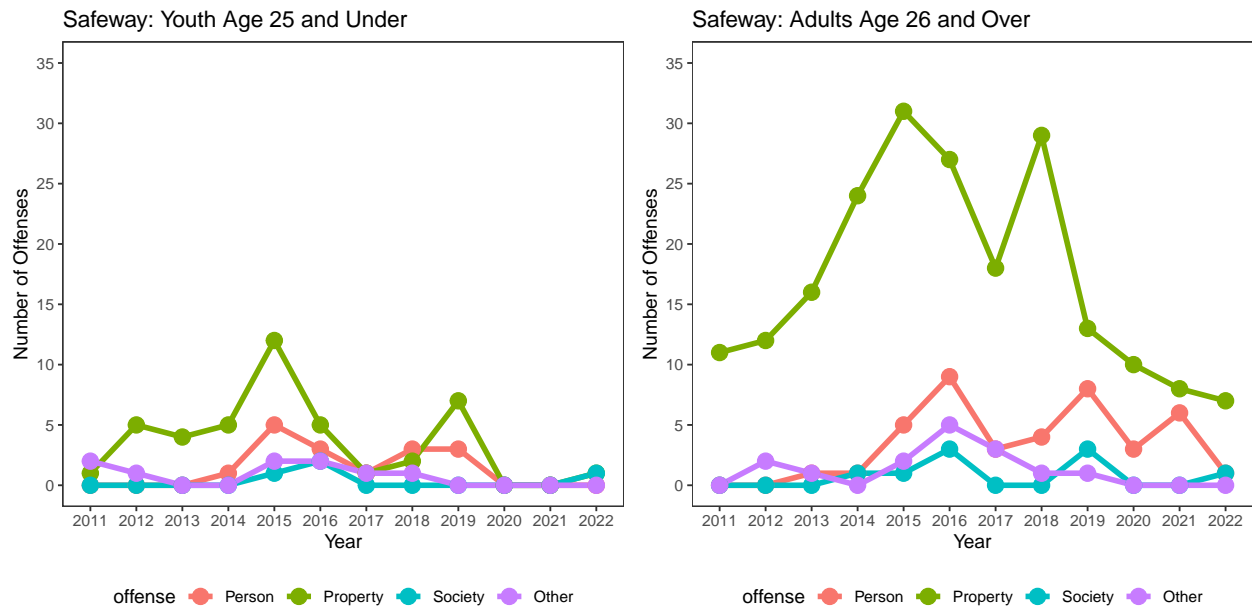

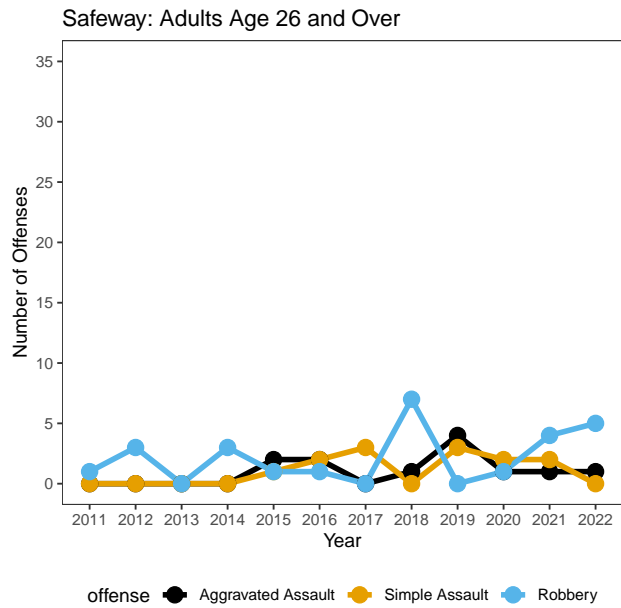
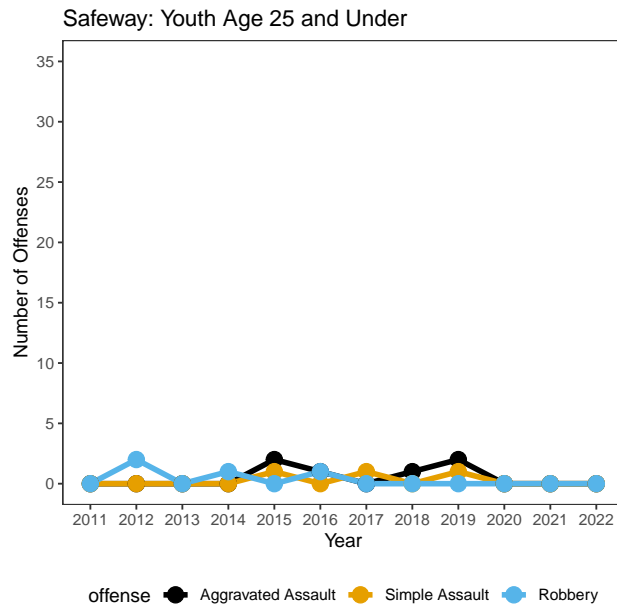
